DESCRIPTION

The 4C Association is an independent, non-governmental, not for profit organization of coffee farmers, trade and industry, and civil society. Members work jointly towards improving economic, social and environmental conditions through sustainable and transparent practices for those who make a living in the coffee sector. The 4C Verification System is based on a Code of Conduct that covers 28 social, environmental and economic principles for all actors in the green coffee supply chain. The verification service is performed by professional independent third-party verifier companies approved by the 4C Association.

FLO is an independent, non governmental, not-for-profit organization that promotes sustainable development and poverty alleviation and sets the Fairtrade standards. Nineteen national organizations, called Fairtrade Labelling Initiatives, market the fairtrade products in 23 countries in Europe, North America, Australia, New Zeland. One organization - FloCert - is responsible for inspection and certification of compliance against the Fairtrade standards.

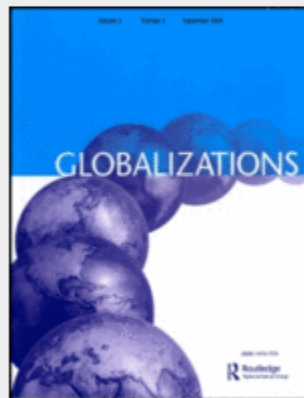
